In management plans for dormice I usually put the following

Bat	Species (if known)	Yes. It is assumed that all woods contain bats			
Good practice will be followed as set out in the Forestry Commission's "Guidance on managing woodlands with bats in England". Surveying for potential bat roosts will be carried out prior to operations, and trees with characteristics that may provide habitat will be protected. Significant proportions of woodland will be left entirely undisturbed in any 10 year period					
	Dormouse	None have been found but the area is within known range			
Good practice will be followed as set out in the Forestry Commission's "Guidance on managing woodlands with dormice in England". Extraction will be by forwarder or trailer and avoid skidding					
	Great Crested Newt	None have been found but it is assumed there may be some individuals			
Good practice will be followed as set out in the Forestry Commission's "Guidance on managing woodlands with great crested newts in England". Extraction will be by forwarder. Timber stacks will be collected as soon as possible.
